REPORT OF MAYOR:

Mayor Dassing welcomed Kevin O’Neill and wished him luck she was sorry that she missed his swearing in and she wished him the best. He is a resident and as he says it was his dream job it was something he wanted to do his whole life.

There will be a Planning Board Master Plan informational get together with Caldwell University on October 3rd at 6PM and we are trying to meet with the bigger entities in town. They will try and make this a quarterly meeting going forward.

Mayor Dassing asked Greg Mascera if there is an ordinance for cutting through parking lots avoid traffic and Greg responded that is Title 39 a motor vehicle violation. The Mayor discussed possibly getting big flags at the corners where pedestrians cross.

The Mayor wanted to mention that we have extra trees from the grant that the Borough has received and if anyone would like a tree please contact Lisa at 973-403-4638.

Council President Cascarano reported that he had the honor of giving remarks at the Annual Caroline Fund which was on Saturday it’s a great fund raiser for cancer research.

Councilman Brown reported that the Caldwell Library is celebrating their 100 year and they will be having a gala on October 12th at 6PM at the Green Brook Country Club. They will be honoring Jane Kinkle who is a retired Grover Cleveland Middle School teacher as well as Karen Klempe Lembo former Library Director and retired New Jersey Deputy Attorney General. They are honoring them for their service to Caldwell. For more information you can log onto www.caldwellpl.org.

Councilman Hauser reported that there was a DPW meeting this evening and the lift purchase is on hold because Mario wants to test a couple of rentals to make sure it’s the right fit for the Community Center. As far as the Dectron Unit there will be a specialist that will come in and give a proposal on that which will cost roughly \$3,000. The generator updated is someone will be coming in on the 25th to inspect the generator that continues to be an issue. There was discussion on the street sweeper and we will be purchasing one which needs to be worked into the Capital Budget likely in 2017 if we can reallocate monies that haven’t been spent in the current Capital Budget. Councilman Brown will take the lead on the garbage cans. The DPW contract will be discussed in Executive Session. Sewer plant compost Paul will touch on and the Capital plan needs to be worked on for the next three years.

REPORT OF BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR:

Paul Carelli reported:

- The DPW contract will be discussed in Executive Session.
- Borough Engineer and the Structural Engineer will be at the October 3rd Council meeting to discuss the parking deck and his plan. He did supply him with a preliminary report that the Council can review.
- Once the Mayor signs the Green Acres grant this will be the conclusion and the Borough will be receiving \$491,000.

- Paul discussed the street signs and showed the Mayor and Council what they would look like.

Vehicles are idling and polluting our Caldwell area. They are blocking driveways to residents and causing traffic hazards due to their parking and positioning on the corner of Essex Road and Park Lane.

ORDINANCE# 1333-17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ARTICLE II, GENERAL LEGISLATION, CHAPTER 109, FIRE PREVENTION OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF CALDWELL, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Caldwell, New Jersey, wishes to modify the terms contained in Chapter 109 to create a Non- Life Hazard Use registry and to update the fee structure for inspections by the Fire Prevention Bureau; and

WHEREAS, in connection therewith, the Council wishes to amend certain provisions contained within Chapter 109 of the Borough Code

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Caldwell, in the County of Essex and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 109 of the “Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Caldwell, New Jersey” is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

That Chapter 109 of the Code of the Borough of Caldwell, the Chapter governing fire prevention, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 109-3 is amended by identifying the existing paragraph as paragraph “A” and by adding Paragraph “B”, “C”, and “D” as follows:

- B. In addition to enforcement of the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the New Jersey Uniform Fire Safety Code, the local enforcement agency shall enforce all other regulations set forth in this Chapter.
- C. The inspections required to be performed under this Chapter shall:
 - 1. Be the inspections required under the Uniform Fire Safety Act, the New Jersey Fire Safety Code and all regulations promulgated under each.
 - 2. An inspection to confirm that explosive gas alarms are installed in a manner and at a location in accordance with manufacturers guidelines in all floors used for occupancy of all buildings within the Borough.
 - 3. Aperiodic inspection of Fire Code Status of all properties other than single and two family residences.
- D. No owner of a building, structure, or dwelling shall sell, lease or otherwise permit occupancy for any purposes of that building, structure, or dwelling without first obtaining from the local enforcement agency a certificate evidencing compliance with this Chapter.

Section 109-4 is modified by adding the following to the end of the existing paragraph:

The local enforcing agency shall additionally conduct periodic inspections of non-Life Hazard Dwellings in accordance with the terms of this Chapter”; and

Section 109-9 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The fees for the inspections and certificates required by this Chapter shall be as set forth in the Borough Fee Schedule (Chapter A270).

Section 109-10 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The local enforcing agency shall issue certificates evidencing compliance with the terms of this Chapter within three business days of conducting an inspection pursuant to this Chapter.

3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

In the subsection titled "Chapter 109, Fire Prevention" add the following between "Certificate of Fire Code Status" and "Non-Life Hazard Registration:

Certificate of Fire Code Status as required by Ordinance 109-3 C 3: \$50.00

2. All Ordinances of the Borough of Caldwell which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.
